Peter Ainsworth MP, Shadow Secretary of State for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs

Peter Ainsworth was educated at Lincoln College, Oxford. On leaving university in 1979, Peter became research assistant to Sir Jack Stewart-Clark, MEP for Sussex East.



Having been active in Conservative politics for a number of years, Peter joined the Bow Group in 1983, serving as an elected member of its governing council in 1984/85 and 1985/86. From 1986 to 1992, he was a councillor in the London Borough of Wandsworth, serving as Chairman of the Conservative Group 1990-1992.

He has been Member of Parliament for East Surrey since April 1992. In December 2005, he was appointed Shadow Secretary of State for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs.

Peter will be presenting a key note speech on “Green Space and Well being”.

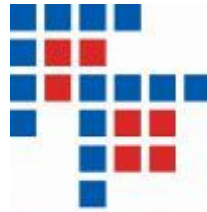
